

2 Questions to Consider Regarding "Unity" of God's People

In a congregation of people from different backgrounds, beliefs, and maturity in Christ, how can they be alike, unified, or one?

How can such a congregation be of one mind and to what extent are they to be of one mind?



In Ephesians 2:11-22, God faced challenges as it relates to unifying His people.

How could he bring people out of perverted Judaism, outright paganism, and idolatry to make them "one" people in Christ? Just imagine the differences regarding their past beliefs! How was He to make them "one" with so many differences? Was this instantaneous or over a period of time? These are the things WE must consider as a local Body of Christ and as we strive to reach the goal of unity.

Continual Challenges of the Early Church

From Galatians chapter 2, through Acts chapters 10, 11, and 15; Romans chapters 14 and 15; and in 1 Corinthians chapters 8 and 9, we can see that the early church faced continual challenges to a mindset of oneness. Unity not only involves doctrinal beliefs, but it involves other areas as well. These are some of the same challenges we face today.

Subscribing to the 7 "Ones"

In Ephesians 4:4-6, there are seven "Ones" the church certainly need to subscribe to. However, the church must continue to stay together and work at developing the perfection of our "oneness of mind and heart".

- Can we not see that we share more in common as believers than what separates us?
